### Children's Mental Health Week

This week is Children's Mental Health Week and the theme for this year is 'Growing Together'. Children across the Federation have focused on this in class as well as in assemblies and they've completed activities to support positive wellbeing. We also created a Federation Mandala today, which celebrates all of the children being a unique part of a united community.

# What's Been Going On?

Here's a snapshot of what's been going on across the Federation. Please also keep checking the Federation website for updates from our year group teams and subject leaders.

### Reception

This half term the children in Reception classes have based their learning on 'Fantasy'. This has included learning and writing linked to a surprise visit from a fairy, creativity around witches and potions and an unannounced visit from an alien!

# Year 1

The children in Year 1 have been learning about the Weather as part of their Weather Experts learning. They have also spent time learning about the Jewish holiday of Purim, which included making Hamantaschen biscuits this week.

#### Year 2

In Year 2 the children have been learning about Air, Land and Sea, including learning about and producing a holiday brochure for Hawaii as a destination. Children also completed research on volcanoes and wrote a newspaper report about the Icelandic volcano that erupted last year. In Design and Technology, each child also created their own small collage representing air, land or sea and these have been put together to create one large textile for the year group which is proudly on display in the Year 2 corridor.

#### Year 3

In Year 3 the children have been learning about the Stone Age and have used many non fictions texts to support this. In Music, children have continued to learn to play the Ukulele in class groups, including singing along with some pieces. It has been an absolute pleasure to hear the children playing and singing together in these lessons, especially after the period of no singing in school due to the pandemic.

#### Year 4

Year 4 children have been learning about mountains and mountain formation in Geography and this culminated with some class presentations at the end of the half term. In Music, the children have also been developing their music knowledge and singing skills with a focus on a new hoe-down song. The year group also took part in a Road Safety session delivered by the Local Authority. The session covered many aspects of road safety, including taking care when using handheld devices when near moving traffic.

#### Year 5

In Year 5, children have used Art lessons to learn about pop art and artists linked to this movement. They have also produced their own pop art pieces. RE lessons have been based on different aspects of Christianity, including specific learning about stained glass windows and sculptures. Geography lessons have included learning about South America, where the text Journey To The River Sea was used to bring the learning to life.

#### Year 6

Year 6 have been learning about Inheritance and Adaption in Science and this will continue after the half term break. In Geography, learning has focused on North America and this will progress to Fair Trade in Spring 2. English lessons have focused on writing about an imaginary creature that would live on Pandora following watching a Pandora video. This has really given everyone the opportunity to develop their creative writing skills and the children have risen to this challenge extremely well.

### Accelerated Reading Word Millionaires

Congratulations to Emily in AR6 for becoming a world millionaire and to Wren in LW5 for being a three time millionaire. What great achievements!

We hope to see some more children achieving world millionaire status after the half term break.

#### World Book Day

On Thursday, 3<sup>rd</sup> March we will be celebrating the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of World Book Day by inviting all children and staff to dress up as a favourite book character.

We hope this will be a fun event, which will stimulate lots of conversations about favourite books and characters. Of course, if your child would rather not take part they can also come into school wearing their Federation uniform as usual.

There is no need to purchase any special costumes or accessories for the day. There are plenty of book characters to consider using clothing items you will already have at home. If you have specific questions please feel free to contact your class teachers, but please remember that all costumes need to be warm enough to wear throughout the school day, practical to wear during learning time as well as at break and lunchtime and with practical footwear to allow us to enjoy the day safely.

#### History Day

The first day back after the half term holiday is a dedicated History Day. All children will be learning about the history of our schools and school life over time and our History leads, Mrs Lee and Mrs Sutterby, have ensured each year group will return to a day of applying the skills of historic enquiry whilst considering how our local area and school life has changed over time.
