They have just been using this as a basis for their learning for the past two weeks. The children have been reading this in their freeflow time, they have remembered important words form the story and are able to recite large parts of the book using storytelling language.

We also have had some lovely videos sent in from home of children reading the story, which we have loved watching.

To build on this, each of the year groups in Years Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have six books over the year that they will be focusing on to develop storytelling language, a love of reading and enhance their skills.

Managing Feelings and Behaviour

We have been discussing the language we use around our traffic light systems, which are there to help children manage their feelings and behaviour.

These will after half term all be a pure traffic light system with no faces etc. This is how we will discuss them with the children.

Green - Good to Go. I'm ready to learn and following the golden rules.

Amber - Pause and think. What can I do to quickly get back to green?

Red - Stop. Take a breath and think of a plan to follow the golden rules and be ready for learning. The adults can help me with this.

Silver – I am showing excellent behaviours for learning and working well with others as well as following the golden rules.

Gold - The adults have seen something excellent from me.

Children can manage their behaviours and get back to green within a lesson by showing the good behaviours for learning and also by following the golden rules. This shows them how they can manage their behaviours and feelings and are supported to do so.

This work also links to our work with some children who may find this exceptionally challenging on the Zones of Regulation. You can read more about this approach here: <u>https://zonesofregulation.com/</u>

All of this work is part of our commitment to supporting children in managing their own feelings and behaviour to be successful both now and in the future.
