The adults were really impressed by their non-stop enthusiasm, determination to succeed, excellent teamwork and support they showed their peers.

MSA Vacancy

We still have a vacancy for a midday supervisor at the Infants. Hours preferably are 11.30-1.30 daily or 12-1.15 on some days.

If you are interested or know anyone who may be, please ask them to contact the infant office for an application form.

Applicants would need to have 2 references that are work based. If you have ever worked with children, a reference would be required from that setting in line with Keeping Children Safe in Education. You would also need to have a full DBS check undertaken.

Turn on the Subtitles!

This is a campaign to improve children's literacy by putting subtitles on TV shows to develop their reading skills. There has been lots of research into it and how much time children spend watching TV and the equivalent number of words they' would have read in books! There are resources on the website for teachers and parents which include how to get subtitles on the different channels/streaming platforms.

Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday 6th February 2024, the children at both the Infant and Junior school celebrated Safer Internet Day. Children at each school had an assembly informing them about the day.

At the Infants the children thought about how technology has changed, and shared examples of what they like to do most on the internet. They then thought about what they can do if they feel unsafe on the internet. Albie in Year 2 said "You can tell a trusted adult" with Addison in Year 1 saying that you could tell "your mum, dad or grandparents" and Jasper said that you can tell a teacher!

Throughout the week in their Computing lessons the children at the Infant listened to the story of 'Mo and Jaz' who were learning to be safe online when watching videos. "I liked how they stopped the video when they were worried" said Mia in Year 2. "I would tell my dad if I saw something I didn't like" said Henry in Year 2. In Reception the children shared the 'Hatch Me Story' and also thought about what to do if you are worried about anything online.

Across the Infant school the children shared the story Chicken Clicking in one of their story slots for the week.

As part of this and to reinforce those messages shared, can we ask all parents to be mindful of checking their child's phone and messages, as there have been exceptionally unkind comments on What's App groups which are unacceptable and should not be happening.

School Meal Charges Increase

Just a reminder that meals for Junior School children will be increasing from the beginning of the Summer term, after Easter.

A school meal for children will cost £2.58 when we return so in the holidays please make sure your account is in credit.

Dojo/Tapestry

We started using dojo in lockdown as a two way communication facility for parents/carers and staff, but continued this afterwards as we know how those little messages and that direct communication can be really helpful to us in delivering the care and education we want for our children.

Thankfully, the majority of parents use this appropriately, but there have recently been a small number who have not been entirely respectful in the messages they send.

Please do treat this in the manner in which it should be used, for meaningful communication, and remember at the end of that message is a person who is doing their very best for everyone, but they are human!
