Please remember:

Reception children come in their uniform and get changed for PE to support with independence and dressing skills

Years 1-6 come in their school PE kit, and in their school shoes and bring trainers in a bag for PE. Here is a reminder about our PE uniform from the website:

PE kit

Children in Reception bring their PE kit in a drawstring bag for the half term. They will change for PE so they can develop the skills of dressing and undressing independently.

Children in Years 1-6 should come to school in their PE kit on PE days. Please note the following for PE kit requirements:

Plain black OR grey jogging bottoms should be worn. No logos etc. These should be loose and not fitted ea not tight.

Black PE shorts. These should be worn if your child does not want to wear jogging bottoms, but not tight cycling shorts, very short shorts or other shorts. In colder weather, or if preferred, black leggings or black base layers may be worn underneath them

Royal Blue plain PE t shirt OR Royal Blue Sports' shirt. Birds sell the plain t shirt in the correct colour from £3. The sports' shirt is of a different fabric and more expensive but may be preferred by some parents/carers or children. You can buy these with or without logos.

School Royal Blue Sweatshirt. The school sweatshirt or cardigan should be worn on PE days.

Children should come to school in their normal school shoes on PE days.

They should bring their plain black trainers in a small drawstring bag and leave them on their peg for PE days.

Earrings. Earrings should be removed on PE days before your child comes to school if they cannot remove them themselves.

Lunch Money

Please make sure that any Junior lunch debts are cleared before the end of the week. Thankyou The price of a school meal will be **increasing** as of 1st September to £2.70 a day due to increasing costs. Therefore please be aware of this price increase if your child will be in Years 3-6 in September when you are topping up lunch money on your account.

New Year 3 will have free lunches all this week and then pay from September, unless they receive means tested Free School Meals. Please note the payment system sometimes takes a couple of days to get in line

with the children moving, so you can pay once it has been set up. This is the company doing it, and not our office staff. You will receive a notification email and text once the system is set up.

SEN Funding

We recently were informed by the LA that due to an overspend they will be cutting the funding coming to schools to support children with SEN. This is of great concern to all schools and I have a meeting planned for the new term with the LA to discuss this further and have also contacted our MP, George Freeman. To support our children, they deserve to be funded correctly and the reality is we are being asked to do more with less.

The LA has an ambition for 99% of children to be in a mainstream setting also and our ambition is that all children are in the right school at the right time for them.

These are difficult times for everyone, including the LA financially, but we remain committed to doing the right thing for our children.

For transparency, I have added the communication from the LA to this letter for everyone.







Local First Inclusion

Changes to SEND top-up funding (Element 3) – information for Norfolk families

Norfolk County Council is working with the government to improve support for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND), in a programme called Local First Inclusion. This is funded and brings £70m of investment from the government and £30m from the council.

A key part of the strategy is to support children to go to school in their local communities and stay in mainstream schools wherever possible.

More and more children, both in Norfolk and nationally, need extra support to learn and this is significantly increasing costs for councils everywhere. The budget that the council receives for specialist education isn't currently enough to cover the cost of provision in place and that means that it is overspent. Specialist school places, particularly those in independent schools, are extremely expensive and not always near to children's homes, or their friends. The council wants to reduce the number of children attending these schools by helping mainstream schools to improve the support they offer. To try to achieve this, it has been giving schools more top-up money, from the schools' budget, to support children's needs earlier, at their local school.

The amount being used for this has grown from around £9m in 2020/21 to £35m this year. However, the number of applications from schools for this money has been a lot higher than anyone expected and led to a £12m overspend on the budget. This means the council has no choice but to work with schools to try to bring this spending under control, otherwise the whole SEND programme and schools' budgets will be at significant risk. A condition of the government funding is that we will balance our budget.

The council has decided to cap the budget at £35m so that it does not overspend further. This is a similar level of funding to that spent last year but it does mean that schools will receive a lower rate of funding for the autumn and spring terms, than they received in the summer term. Schools had been expecting to have more money and had made plans for the next academic year based on different rates. The council understands that making this decision mid-year will cause difficulties for some schools and it hasn't taken this decision lightly, but the budget is at its very limit. The council is working with schools to try to reduce the impact on children as much as possible, particularly for those moving from nursery to primary school or from primary school to high school.

Goodbye Year 6

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are changing!



With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence.

The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.
- Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

- The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:
- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days.

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

- The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the
 case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court. Prosecution can result
 in criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.
- Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.
