New SEND and Inclusion Helpline

As part of their Local First Inclusion programme, Norfolk County Council are continuing to look for new ways to help you to support children and young people with SEND.

There's lots of information available on both the Norfolk Schools website <u>Special Educational Needs and Disabilities</u> (SEND) - Norfolk Schools and Learning Providers - Norfolk County Council and the Local Offer.

However, if you can't find the information you need to support children and young people with SEND, or those at risk of exclusion..

There is a new phone line available on weekdays from 9am until 5pm and you can now call them on 0333 313 7165 and speak to a professional for advice and information. It will make it easier for families to get the information they might need. The team can give you advice on children and young people with SEND.

They know that parents can sometimes find it difficult to find the information they need, being able to talk to someone to navigate the support on offer will help ensure that the right support is available at the right time, first time.

They would like all families to ring the support line before they apply for an EHCP needs assessment. This is to make sure they are doing all we can at the earliest opportunity to support families. The new phoneline will also help to ensure that you get to the right service and reduce the number of different teams you might need to speak to about a child.

They hope that by getting the right support to children earlier, they can improve outcomes and reduce the need for Education Health and Care Plans.

SENDIASS, which is an impartial service supporting families, will continue with its existing number.

As the SEND and Inclusion support line is a new service, they will be closely monitoring it to ensure its success, gaining feedback, and developing it further over the coming weeks and months.

They are also working with schools and partners to develop additional opportunities, where they aim to develop a 'team around the school' approach that endeavour to wrap support around schools from a number of different professionals.

Federation Values

We have been working hard discussing and learning our new Federation this half term. These are values for now and for their future.

These are:

Autumn 1 - Respect, Autumn 2 - Honesty, Spring 1 - Resilience, Spring 2 - Collaboration, Summer 1 - Kindness, Summer 2 - Empathy

All values are introduced at the beginning of the academic year and referred back to throughout the year, with a deeper focus each half term on each one.

This half term we have been pleased with how many children show respect, respect for each other and respect for rules and processes too. The children have been able to explain what this means. One child in each class has been chosen to receive a values certificate this half term. Please do discuss the values with your child and how they can show these, in and out of school.

Free Emotional Support for Year 6 children - Kooth

Kooth have now extended our Kooth service to 10 year olds! They will be delivering virtual school wellbeing assemblies in November and December and Mrs rathi has signed up for our Year 6 students to learn about Kooth and the support they can access to add to their mental health & wellbeing toolkit.

Year 6 have this free, safe and anonymous support available to them for whatever they are going through. Kooth can provide ongoing valuable support. Kooth can give additional support for students who may already be receiving support through school counsellors, MHST and CAMHS.

Kooth offer free support with <u>no</u> waiting lists. Kooth is a safe and anonymous space for young people to talk about their wellbeing without the fear of judgement. They have clinical practitioners on hand to offer one-to-one support through text-based counselling, operating after school hours, on weekends, and during school holidays. Our Year 6 students can access the immediate help they need without a formal referral.

Black History Month Tuesday 15th October 2024

Key Stage 2 met for an assembly of online music with Midé Naike.

Midé Naike talked about his Beat Box journey from the age of 16. He was originally from Nigeria, but now lives in Birmingham. In his group he has musicians from Italy, Jamaica etc who all bring their musical influences and genres to the mix. He explained that Beat Box is like the drums, creating a rhythm and he gave us a demonstration.

We joined in with a warm up of our faces and mouths, to make sure that we were ready to join in. We also practiced our breathing techniques, before we learnt some of the sounds and combined them. We were able to clap along to the rhythms which is an important skill.

Midé explained the role of a DJ and how they like to do "scratching" ie with the word "hello". He had us pretending to bounce a word off a wall and back, in different voices. We also imitated various musical instruments with our voices, which the children thoroughly enjoyed and sounded quite impressive!

Healthy Homes

Breckland have launched a service known as Breckland Healthy Homes which will be looking to help tenants and Landlords from Private rented properties where there is damp and mould or concerns about conditions that might lead to disrepair.

Calling all Private Tenants and Landlords

Breckland Council is launching the 'Breckland Healthy Homes Service' to help prevent and tackle damp, mould and condensation in the private rented sector

Funded by the UK Government

The Healthy Homes project has been launched to test different approaches to improving damp and mould enforcement in private rented homes across a number of local authorities. The project was administered under the previous government and led jointly by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG), the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC), and the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) and was funded through HM Treasury's Shared Outcomes Fund.

We offer support, advice and guidance to private tenants and private landlords, this includes:

- Working with you to understand improvements that could be made to your home
- Helping you to understand and access funding opportunities
- Signposting for fuel tariff guidance, aiming to reduce utility bills

- Help to understand the causes of damp and mould
 - Borrow home hygrometer/data logger kits
- Home visits
